COMPETITION 3: Your research in 180 seconds

This session invites participants to present their research in 180 seconds in a clear, concise, and convincing manner. Theme: Resilience and early life adversity.

Interested participants are requested to send their abstracts on or before 12th February, 2019 to resilienceSeminar2019@gmail.com. Six participants will be further shortlisted for the final competition that will be held on the day of the seminar. The abstract should be written in double spacing, Times New Roman, font size 12 and limited to 300 words covering introduction, rationale, methodology, results, implications, and conclusion.

Participants can submit ongoing research with preliminary findings; however, research that has already been completed will be given priority in the final selection process.

Gift vouchers will be awarded to the first and second place winners for all three competitions.
